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Capacity-Building for Docents & Mediators

- Training pillars: co-design facilitation, inclusive practice (POD), Arabic-first scripts, digital mediation (QR/audio/AR).

Established in 2003, Art Jameel is an independent organisation that supports artists and creative communities

Art Jameel's two institutions – **Jameel Arts Centre (2018)**, an innovative contemporary institution in Dubai, UAE and **Hayy Jameel (2021)**, a dedicated complex for the arts and creativity in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, offer programmes across exhibitions, commissions, research, learning and community-building in order to promote contemporary art and creative entrepreneurship across the Middle East and beyond.

Art Jameel's model is collaborative:

Locally, the organisation works with individuals, organisations and government to develop innovative programming that embraces both ancient and new technologies, and encourages entrepreneurship and the development of cultural networks









Art Jameel Learning

Learning is central to Art Jameel's way of working: we believe the arts enrich communities, with a unique capacity to nurture **critical thought**, **understanding** and a sense of **belonging**

Our scope spans a diverse spectrum of educational opportunities – from working with government to deliver schools programmes through to apprenticeships and indepth courses for artists and curators and itinerant initiatives for youth, students and lifelong-learners

- How can we nurture conceptual and critical thinking, across all ages?
- What approaches allow programming to be engaging, inclusive and interactive?
- How can our region's youth achieve excellence in the arts and take their place on the world stage?










Arts as prism: lifelong learning

Recess / الفحسة:

An After School Art Programme

An alternative after-school art programme designed for ambitious teens who crave serious participation and learning in the arts. Taking the learning outside of the classroom, the programme invites you to explore intersections between contemporary art, cultural and local contexts and places an emphasis on conceptual, perceptual, and practical knowledge building.

Recess is a one-of-a-kind multidisciplinary art program that provides teens ages 14–18 with a foundation in the arts. Weekly classes include a wide range of art techniques including design, drawing, material experiments, bookbinding, digital art and printmaking. Students also complete collaborative and individual art assignments, attend trips and visits to arts and cultural institutions, develop art portfolios, learn about the ins and outs of what goes into making art and have the opportunity to interact and get mentored by artists, curators, and mentors.

The programme spans over twelve sessions and includes:

- Core Art Studio: Learn about regional art history, local artists, and art movements! Note your findings in your own handbound art portfolio.
- **Research Sessions**: How do artists see the world? Learn to ask questions and research answers creatively in our research sessions.
- Practical Art Studio: Experiment with new mediums, techniques, and processes including sessions on printmaking, digital design, prototyping, and material studies.
- Cultural Field Trips: Venture outside of Hayy Jameel into the field, with visits to local cultural sites such as the Islamic Biennale, Al-Balad, and exclusive visits to artist studios.








Capacity Building: Creative Careers Days

A first in the Middle East, Creative Careers Days launched in 2022 at Jameel Arts Centre, UAE with three iterations to date looking at introducing the arts and design and the multidisciplinarity of the creative sector. The even is in partnership with the Ministry of Culture, United Arab Emirates

The annual career festival has welcomed over **8,000+** visitors annually including **school** and university students and lifelong learners, families and teachers.

The festival is **free and open to all**, featuring informational booths, leading arts organisations, universities and government entities, alongside a rolling programme of inspirational talks and practical workshops by industry leaders, tours and performances and portfolio reviews and one-to-one sessions

Featured over 96 Total Activations in 2025: including portfolio reviews, workshops, talks, performances and more

Capacity Building: The Assembly

The Assembly cohorts comprise of **young individuals aged 18-25 years old**, who are residents of the UAE. Cohort members **specialise in a range of creative disciplines**, including **visual arts, design, architecture, research and writing, performing arts and more**. They represent a **variety of global backgrounds**, including UAE, Saudi Arabia, Lebanon, Palestine, Egypt, Nigeria, Sudan, India, Pakistan, Philippines, Lithuania, Cyprus, Brazil and Colombia, amongst others

Capacity Building: The Assembly

The Assembly is a yearly talent development programme designed to support young artistic leadership in the UAE. Each year, young creatives aged 18 to 24 are selected via a competitive nomination and interview process

The platform's multidisciplinary cohort of UAE-based practising creatives collaborate through fortnightly sessions to **explore ways of engaging with the arts and creative practices in contemporary arts spaces**, through discussions on topics of ongoing relevance; explore personal creative interests within the framework of the programme; gain knowledge-based skills; visit exhibitions on view at Jameel Arts Centre; and connect with artists, curators and other cultural producers and leaders

- Peer-to-peer information exchange
- Collaborative commissioned projects
- Curatorial practices as learning exercise







Capacity Building: The Assembly

The Assembly learning programme offers various opportunities to cohort members to **engage with curatorial practices in contemporary arts spaces**. These include presentations and workshops, exhibition tours, engagement opportunities with artists, curators and other cultural professionals, crit and feedback sessions. Through this, they **develop necessary skills for developing creative projects, exhibitions and public programmes**, such as developing research and curatorial proposals, commissioning artists and other creatives, producing exhibitions and facilitating experiential programmes.

The Assembly programme culminates with the **Youth Takeover** exhibition, incubated through the Spring and presented annually in May: this **experimental exhibition and public programmes project** takes over Jameel Arts Centre's **non-gallery spaces** with a series of artwork commissions and experiences, workshops, performances, tours and thematic activations. The participating cohort leads the Youth Takeover, with guidance from the Art Jameel team, in conceptual research and curatorial thinking, exhibition design and production, programme development and the multiple efforts that bring the immersive project to fruition. The Youth Takeover **expands the network of the programme** beyond just Assembly members by commissioning numerous artists, creatives and communities to produce artworks and public programmes.

To date, The Assembly programme has produced 7 Youth Takeover projects

Specially designed and equipped to encourage young people to explore, experiment and create, Hayy Explorers offers a dynamic programme of Walk-ins Activities, Scheduled Workshops, Camps and Youth Programmes, as well as programmes catered to Arts Educators and artists/teachers.



After a few years of successful experimentation, the Lab gave birth to the Cité des bébés in December 2024

- For the comfort of toddlers, the Cité des bébés Lab is restricted to babies only, from 0 to 23 months, supervised by an adult.
- Designed as a secure nest, the Cité des bébés Lab encourages the cognitive and psychomotor development of babies.
- This warm space is an opportunity for babies, families, and professionals to meet.
- The playful atmosphere is enriched throughout the year by workshops adapted to toddlers (storytelling, theatrical readings, sign language activities, etc.)




