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

标题: 故宫的无障碍努力

背后的故事:故宫的无障碍改造历史要追溯到20世纪初。当时,受到西方文化影响的末代皇帝溥仪为了骑自行车,锯掉了宫内的多重门槛。不过,这些门槛并没有被随意丢弃,而是被安上了榫头,门框上凿出了卯眼,以确保它们能够被正确地放回原处。2001年7月13日,中国成功申办第29届夏季奥运会和残奥会,这为中国的无障碍环境建设带来了历史性的转机。2002年11月,故宫正式宣布投资百万,正式开始铺设无障碍通道,通道南起故宫内太和门东侧的昭德门,北止

故宫博物院是一座特殊的博物院,因为它建立在明清两朝皇宫——紫禁城的基础上。在故宫,你既可以看到大气巍峨的宫廷建筑,又可以欣赏到两个王朝留下来的奇珍异宝,在186万余件文物中回顾历史的变迁和艺术的成就。

故宫在无障碍方面做出了很大的努力,铺设了无障碍坡道,修建了无障碍的洗手间,还制作了官方的手语导览和适合轮椅使用者的无障碍路线图。虽然轮椅伙伴现在还没有办法进入大部分的展览馆,但这并不影响我们去欣赏中国的古建筑之美。

Publication


4 persons with disabilities serve as editors for the final bilingual publication produced by UNESCO and Chinese Museums Association (ICOM China).
